3. Align the transferability timeline of 48E credits with credit availability.
4. Simplify FEOC (Foreign Entity of Concern) rules to prevent supply chain disruptions.

These updates are essential to keeping clean energy competitive, supporting job growth, and ensuring energy freedom remains accessible to everyday Americans.
